Readings for the 1st Sunday of Lent (pp. 415-416): This year's Lenten season is occurring within the 'Year of Mercy' proclaimed by Pope Francis. So as we humbly seek to confront the reality of our own sins and failings, we will do well to recall that we have a loving Savior whose very reason for coming among us as a man is to offer us the fullness of his mercy and forgiveness, Satan's temptations of our Lord in the desert (Luke's Gospel) show his intent to get us to put human considerations before faith in God and his word of mercy and salvation. Moses (1st reading, Deuteronomy) reminds the Israelites of the mighty works God has done to show them his total trustworthiness. St. Paul reminds us that Christian faith – belief in the Gospel of the Risen Christ – is now necessary for justification (grace and reconciliation with God) and for eternal salvation itself.

Special Collection for Church in Central & Eastern Europe: Today at both Masses we will take up the annual collection to help restore the Church in those countries that suffered so much under Communism, including, Hungary, very to dear to us at SMV. Thanks for your generosity!
